From autumn walks through town to tearful graduation slideshows, Concord Carousel Preschool teaches children to build up their community, both within the walls of our school and beyond.

*Mission Statement of the CCPSF*

To provide financial assistance to families who could not send their children to Concord Carousel Preschool without aid.

*Why a Scholarship Fund?*

A high-quality preschool experience is important to the growth of children. Carousel parents see firsthand how Concord Carousel Preschool promotes the physical, social, emotional, and cognitive growth of our children. For further proof-in-the-preschool-pudding, an [NPR.org](http://NPR.org) article cites multiple, recent studies on the long term benefits of a "high-quality" preschool, with high-quality defined as small class sizes, student-directed learning, and lots of open-ended play. Does this sound like a page out of the Concord Carousel Preschool's playbook? It is. These components are at the core of the Carousel curriculum.

Concord Carousel Preschool believes it is vital to our community and the development of our children to help families in need. **We need our community's support to meet this objective.** Concord Carousel Preschool is self-funded: all program costs such as teachers' salaries, supplies, and janitorial needs come out of Preschool user fees with no additional funding from the town. The Scholarship Fund will help make high-quality preschool available to more families without further tapping into user funding.

*Fundraising Goal*

Our goal is to raise \$5,000 by May 31, 2017. This money will fund awards for the 2017/2018 school year.
